



TEACH FY21 Listening Session Feedback

(Date 10/23/2020)

1. If we received the grant in the prior year, can we still access those funds?

- Yes, grant funding awarded in FY20 and FY19 can still be used to purchase eligible infrastructure items.
- The FY19 TEACH Infrastructure Grant purchase period is for July 1, 2018 through December 31, 2020. All FY19 reimbursement are due by February 19, 2021.
- The FY20 TEACH Infrastructure Grant purchase period is July 1, 2019 through March 15, 2022. All FY20 reimbursements are due by May 14, 2022.

2. So, if you only used 1/2 of your available funding for FY20 can that be used for funding in FY21?

- If your school district or library applied for and was awarded only ½ of the available funding in FY20 you can still apply for funding in FY21.
- > Please remember, application for FY21 are due by Friday, December 18, 2020 by 11:59 p.m.
- > Maximum awards include grant funding in the FY20 biennium and is subject to availability.

3. Is there a place to see if the District has maxed out on allowable funding?

- Every school district and library would have received a grant budget that outlines the grant funds awarded in FY20. If you did not receive this information, please call TEACH at 608-261-5054 or email TEACH at <u>teach@wisconsin.gov</u> for funding amounts.
- 4. Can I do a revision to the FY20 amounts reducing those amounts so she can re-apply them to the FY21 grant?
 - Grant recipients can not revise or reduce award amounts receive in FY20. Grant funding awarded in FY20 can be used to purchase infrastructure items until March 15, 2022.

5. Is FY21 a continuation/part of FY20 or is this a new \$30,000 funding?

- In FY2021 (July 1, 2020 June 30, 2021) \$3.0M is available in TEACH Information Technology Infrastructure Grants to eligible rural school districts and public libraries.
- > Maximum funding amounts for the biennium include award funding received in FY20 and FY21.
