Listening Session Takeaways

These important topics were addressed during the FY19 Educational Technology Training Grant Listening Session.

LIBRARIES

- 1. Can Cooperative Educational Service Agencies (CESA) serve as fiscal agents for eligible libraries?
 - At this time CESAs may not represent libraries as their fiscal agent.
- 2. Who is considered a librarian with the TEACH grant?
 - Individuals **employed by a library as a librarian** will be considered a librarian and eligible to receive funds for training with the TEACH Educational Technology Training Grant. (Note: This definition does not apply to school district librarians. See referce for school librarians below under schools.)

SCHOOLS

- 3. Are school district librarians eligible to attend TEACH training events?
 - The TEACH Educational Technology Training Grant is for *teachers* to receive technology training. School district librarians who possess a teaching license, have a school district position that requires a teaching license and are required to teach for their employment are eligible for grant funding to attend TEACH training events.

LIBRARIES & SCHOOL DISTRICTS

- 4. Can school district or library staff assist facilitators?
 - School district and library staff may only volunteer to assist non-consortium facilitators. Facilitators and helpers of facilitators may *not* be employed by a school district or library. Training events where school district or library staff are compensated are *not* eligible for reimbursement with TEACH Educational Technology grant funds.
